The Layout

Brief Description

1. **Search Tab** – Search the historical aerials available and locate the property you are looking for by address, land owner name, or parcel ID number.
2. **Layers Tab** – Turn on/off additional layers in the map viewer and view the legend.
3. **Map Viewer** – An interactive map viewer.
4. **Property Information Table** – Contains the results from the Owner Name or Parcel ID search.

1. Search Tab Functionality

Change the year the map references

2. **Base Maps** – Make a selection as to what year you would like to view.

- a. 1939 - Obtained from Moore County Soil & Water Department
- b. 1950 - Obtained from Moore County Soil & Water Department
- c. 1966 - Obtained from Moore County Soil & Water Department
- d. 1972 - Obtained from Moore County Soil & Water Department
- e. 1983 - Obtained from Moore County Soil & Water Department
- f. 1988 - Obtained from Moore County Library
- g. 2003 - Obtained from Moore County Public Safety
- h. 2007 - Obtained from Moore County GIS/Public Safety
- i. 2010 - Obtained from Moore County GIS/Public Safety




3. **Transitional** – Slide the control to the desired year.

This control **does not work in Internet Explorer (IE)**.

It has successfully been tested in Firefox, Chrome, and Safari web browsers. It may take a few moments for the aerial photography to load the first time.

Once the aerials have all been loaded at a desired zoom level then the slider can be used to quickly transition between the different image years.




Address Search

Step 1: Begin typing in the address search bar and a list of valid Moore County addresses will begin to populate. You can either finish typing your address or select from the drop-down menu.

Step 2: Select the “Locate” button and a red dot with the address will appear on the map viewer.

Step 3: Use the zoom tools at the top of the application to navigate to your address.



Property Search

Step 1: You can search property within Moore County by either searching for:

1. Last Name, First Name
2. Last Name
3. First Name
4. Parcel ID number (include any 0's)

Owner Name or Parcel ID:
Example: Last Name, First Name OR 00002151



Step 2: Select the “Locate” button and a red dot with the address will appear on the map viewer.

Step 3: All parcels that match the search results will be highlighted blue and appear in the Property Information Table. Use either the zoom tools at the top of the application to navigate to the correct property or use the table to find the correct property. The table columns can be sorted if needed. Once you have identified the correct property record select it to zoom the map viewer to that location.

2. Layer Tab


Turn layers on or off by selecting the checked boxed. Note that some layers will only turn on when zoomed in with the map viewer. A dynamic legend will appear based on what layers are visible in the map viewer.



3. Map Viewer




Select and then draw a box in the map viewer area that you wish to zoom into. You can also use either the mouse wheel for zooming if available or double click to zoom into the map.




Select and draw a box in the area that you wish to zoom out of. You can also use the mouse wheel for zooming if available.



Select to zoom to the full extent of Moore County.




Select to zoom to the previous extent of the map viewer.



Select to zoom to the next extent of the map viewer.



Select to move the map in any direction at the current zoom level. You can also select the map viewer without using the tool and pan the map.



If you selected a tool and you want to return back to using your mouse to control the map viewer then just select this button to deactivate any of the tools on the toolbar.



Clears any graphics on the map viewer that may have resulted from using the search tools.



Prints the map viewer to a pdf document. Must have popup blocker disabled on your web browser. This button **does not work in Internet Explorer (IE)**. It has successfully been tested in Firefox, Chrome, and Safari web browsers.

Selecting a parcel in the map viewer

Click once on any property to select the property and obtain land owner information about that property. You can obtain more land owner information by selecting the "Tax Department PRC Card" hyperlink at the bottom of the information window.
